

Authors are responsible for formatting all references and abiding by the journal style. The journal will charge \$2.00 USD for each if the authors cannot format their references instead by the production department.

Following guideline is suitable for both Science Insights Education Frontiers (SIEF) and Best Evidence in Chinese Education (BECE).

Citations in Text

- All sources listed in the reference list must be cited at appropriate points in the text by the author's last name, publication year, and pagination where appropriate, as indicated.
- When the author's name is in the text: Rader (1975).
- When the author's name is not in text: (Wills, 1976).
- When citing pagination (for a quote): (Bell, 1967, p62).
- With dual authorship, give both names with an ampersand (&) between: (Sutton & George, 2012).
- For three or more authors including three, use "et al." after the first author's last name: (Cheung et al., 2020).
- For institutional authorship, identify from the beginning of the complete citation: (U.S. Bureau of the Census, 1963, p117).
- When more than one reference to an author was published in one year, distinguish them by use of letters (a, b) attached to the publication year: (Richard, 1956a).
- Enclose a series of references (in alphabetical order) within one pair of parentheses, separated by semicolons: (Bowles & Gintis, 2019; Coleman, 2021a; Kaiser, 2020).

Reference Format


List all items alphabetically by author and, within the author, by publication year on a separate page. Examples of common references follow:
